## In Home Support Services (72D)

**Purpose:** To provide in-home supports to children with developmental disabilities and their families in order to prevent out of home placement.

The Home Intervention Program is funded through the Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities with the intent of providing intervention for children who are in danger of being removed from their families and placed in more restrictive care. The program provides targeted case management and individual intervention to families in their natural environments.

### **Eligibility:**

Must be under the age of 18

Must have a developmental disability

Must have prior funding approval from the Department of Human Services to receive services

### **How to Apply for Services**

Contact AID's Admission Department

### **Type of Services Provided**

Services are individually tailored to meet the needs of the children and their families but center around 15 hours of direct service and 2 ½ hours of case management/advocacy.

### **Where Services are Provided**

Services are provided in the individuals natural environments: in the home, in the community, and places the family chooses.

### **Outcome Measure/Goals**

Maximize the % of children served who remain in their natural environment (96%)

Maximize the % of children discharged from the program with a positive outcome (85%)

Maximize family satisfaction with the program (88%)

Cost efficiency

### **Qualifications of Staff**

Case Management Services will be provided by staff with extensive training and experience working with individuals with developmental disabilities. Direct service staff will be at least 18 years of age, enrolled in High School or a High School Graduate. Staff must be interviewed and approved by the individual's family and/or guardians..
