Staff members are carefully screened and complete a thorough training to learn and practice providing personal care for all participants. AID strives to provide a participant to staff ratio of five to one.

## The Application Process

Call 630-966-4251 to request an application or download a copy from our web site at [www.the-association.org](http://www.the-association.org). Submit the completed application and a \$25 non-refundable deposit. Once your application has been accepted, you will receive a confirmation packet in the mail.

To be accepted, participants must have a physical disability or developmental delay. This includes residual paralysis due to polio, cerebral palsy, spina bifida, or other physical disabilities such as amputation, congenital deformities, speech and hearing difficulties and those who are not functioning at the appropriate developmental age level. Eligibility is also based on the potential benefit to the camper and their ability to participate in the program. Please note that all participants must have had a physical examination during the previous year.

A limited number of participants will be accepted to ensure quality of care. Priority will be given to past participants of AID's Camp Forever and clients who are enrolled in AID's Employment and Rehabilitation or Day Programs. If space allows, applications from people in AID's CILA (Community Integrated Living Arrangement) program and those unaffiliated with AID will be considered.

## About AID

AID is a nonprofit, community-based organization that serves over 5,100 individuals throughout Kane, Kendall, DeKalb, DuPage, suburban Cook and Will Counties. More than 20 programs are available for individuals with physical and developmental disabilities, and those in need of behavioral health services or crisis intervention. All proceeds from this event will go to benefit AID programs.
